

The work that has been going on for more than fifteen years is finally over. Kerida, the oldest shrine in the country, will reopen its doors in mid-December. The work began more than fifteen years ago following the discovery of an ancient painting on one of the walls.

The shrine in honour of Freya has been there for over 400 years. This is why the Ducentae government decided to carry out an analysis of the state of the infrastructure. At the end they realized that it was less safe than it seemed, so they approved the renovation plan.

In addition to renovating the infrastructure and thus making it safer for all parishioners, they have made this magical place much more unique. Paintings that before could hardly be distinguished between the walls shine like never before. 

But who is Patricia Potere? What makes her an icon? And why had she been traveling for 5 vears?



Not only did she love it, she was also incredibly talented.

Her teachers described her as: "a natural", "extraordinary", "outstanding" etc. It is also at this school that she found the love her life, another impressive painter, Georgia Bianchi.

She became a world-wide phenomenon and has had the opportunity to organize exhibitions at numerous galleries all over the UBN. A true Ducentaen icon!

A world trip through the UBN

About 6 years ago Georgia Bianchi, Potere's girlfriend, passed away at the age of 62. She eventually lost the battle against breast cancer. A great loss for all of her friends and family. For Potere this was a sign that she had to leave Ducentae and go travel the world. In remembrance of her lover, Potere decided to visit hospitals in every country she passed through during her trip. In the clinics she met lots of women who were, just like Potere's girlfriend, fighting against some



form of cancer. She talked to them, spent some time with them and their families and eventually painted them. In a recent interview Potere said "It was tough seeing these women suffer like Georgia did. It made me realize even more how unfair this disease is. But it was the hope in the eyes of these women that gave me the strength to continue my journey." Later in the interview she said: "The experience didn't heal me. But it sure helped me."

After 5 years of traveling, Potere arrived back home with 27 portraits but most importantly with 27 stories of strong and powerful women. 27 stories she wants to share with the world. The painter has revealed that the portraits will be exhibited next summer in one of the main museums of Ducentae. Which one it will be, hasn't been revealed yet. Not only the faces of the 27 women will be shown at the exhibition but also their stories. Of course there will also be a portrait of the painter's departed lover Georgia Bianchi.
